

Audition Tips



1. Preparation is key! The more prepared you are, the more successful your recording will be. This is our only opportunity to get to know you, so submit a recording that represents your best work.
2. Unlike in a live audition, in a video audition you can control every aspect of your environment. Use this to your advantage! Choose a quiet, clean location to film your audition, where you are comfortable with the acoustics and where you will be free from distractions.
3. Leave yourself more time than you think you will need to record your audition. Make several different recordings and you will be able to choose the highest quality version to submit. Don't be afraid to ask friends or teachers for feedback on your audition recording, or for their help to make a selection if you have several good takes!
4. Always listen back to your recordings to be sure you are satisfied with the quality of your performance, as well as the quality of the recording itself.
5. Looking professional on camera can go a long way. It's not necessary to bring out your tuxedo, but dressing and acting professionally on camera is an easy way to set the tone for your recording and to let the audition committee know that you are taking the audition process seriously.
